Our Foundation Makes Its First Grants

Through the generosity of our donors, The Lakewood Masonic Foundation has made its first grants in accordance with its stated purposes—one to The Lakewood Masonic Temple Company for historic preservation purposes and one to the Masonic Service Association of North American for charitable purposes.

A grant of \$10,000 was made to the Temple Company to cover a portion of the costs of replacing the copper rain gutters consistent with their original historic state. This project will help to prevent water infiltration into the building and the resulting damage to interior plaster and decorations. According to the National Park Service's Technical Preservation Division, "uncontrolled moisture is the most prevalent cause of deterioration in older and historic buildings."

A grant of \$500 was made to the Masonic Service Association for Hurricane Katrina relief. The MSA in turn is dividing the proceeds among the Grand Lodges of Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama for their respective relief programs.

Your gifts to The Lakewood Masonic Foundation will enable us to make additional grants for similarly worthy purposes. The Lakewood Masonic Temple Company has applied to the Foundation for a grant to begin urgently needed window repairs, especially to the pivot windows on the Lodge Room balcony level. Water infiltration around these windows is causing serious damage to interior plaster and painted decorations and must be corrected as quickly as possible. The deteriorated windows also contribute to heat loss, a problem that will be especially costly this winter in light of record high natural gas prices. Our Foundation has agreed to help raise funds for this crucial historical preservation project. Your gift will help keep water outside where it belongs and heat inside where it belongs so that our historic home can be preserved for future generations. You can use the form on page 11. Lakewood Lodge Makes Lead Gift

Lakewood Lodge has made a generous lead gift of \$10,000 directly to the Operating Fund of The Lakewood Masonic Temple Company to cover a portion of the cost of replacing the copper rain gutters. The Lodge was one of the original Masonic groups that formed The Lakewood Masonic Temple Company and saw to the design and construction

of our now historic home. Lakewood Lodge held the first meeting in the new Temple on October 2, 1916, and has met in the LMT ever since.

Gifts to the Temple Company's Operating Fund or Endowment Fund are *not* deductible for federal tax purposes, but may be of interest to donors not needing or benefiting from a tax deduction.

Getting More Bang for Your Buck

Do you have appreciated securities in your portfolio? If so, donating those securities directly to The Lakewood Masonic Foundation could benefit you more than if you sold them and then made a cash contribution. How could this be?

When you sell securities at a price higher than your original cost, you are subject to either a normal income tax or a capital gains tax on the profits of your investment, depending on the length of time you held the securities and on whether you have offsetting capital losses. When you then donate the cash proceeds to our Foundation, you are entitled to a charitable deduction to the extent permitted by law. However, if you donate your appreciated securities directly without first selling them, you do not have to pay the tax on your investment profits; and you are still entitled to the charitable deduction based on the market value of the securities as of the date of your donation. This technique permits you to either reduce the effective cost of your donation or to make a commensurately larger donation at the same cost to you. Of course, you are always encouraged to seek legal and tax counsel before entering into any such transaction.

Our Foundation is now prepared to accept gifts of stocks, bonds or other securities. Please contact the Foundation for details that you or your broker will need to effect the transaction.

If we are to save our historic home for future generations of Masons and Eastern Stars, your gifts to The Lakewood Masonic Foundation will be absolutely essential to fund vitally needed preservation projects. Gifts to the Foundation—whether stocks, other securities, life insurance, property or cash—are deductible for federal tax purposes to the extent permitted by law.

Foundation Web Site Debuts

At the Lakewood Masonic Foundation we may focus most of our attention on the preservation of our historic Lakewood Masonic Temple, but we are also looking to the future with the debut of our new web site at www.lakewoodmasonicfoundation.org.

Visitors to our site will find information on the nature and purposes of our Foundation, our activities and how to donate funds to support us in our mission. There is a section covering our Temple building, its history, location and use by other community organizations as well as rental information. There are sections for each of the organizations in the Lakewood Masonic Family, including their histories and roots and past and current leadership. Visitors will also find a calendar of events for the building as well as individual calendars for each Masonic group.

As with all web sites, ours will always be a work in progress. If you have internet access, we urge you to visit our site and add it to your list of favorites so that you can check back frequently. Your feedback and suggestions are particularly welcome as we embark on this new communication pathway.

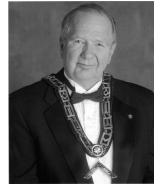

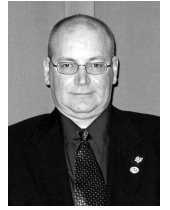

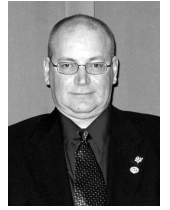

Commander's Message

Greetings, fraters! This month, I will share with you some selections from a Christian classic, *The Imitation of Christ*, written in Latin in 1429 by Augustinian monk Thomas à Kempis, whose actual surname was Hämerken or Hämerlein, and who hailed from a town in Germany known as Kempen.

Whoever shadows my every move won't lose me in the dark.

Referring to Biblical scholars, "a lot of us spend more time studying hard than living well. That's such a mistake. All that does is produce a tree that bears no fruit ... the question to be posed isn't whether we read the right books, but whether we did the good deeds. ... The truly educated? Those who engaged God's will and disengaged their own in one and the same transaction ... If read you must, then read on, letting the love of Truth be your guide. Don't ask who wrote it. Just pay attention to what's said. ... If you want to satisfy your thirst for Scriptures, forget about scholarship. Read humbly, simply, faithfully; that's the way they were written."

The person who hasn't died to himself is easy game for the Enemy's guile. God ... helps the humble and humbles those who think that they have no need of help. Don't think better of yourself than others. Why? Because at that very moment God might just think you worse than others. ... The humble soul's vista is shimmering with peace. The heart of the proud soul, however, is frequently clouded with jealousy or rage.

Each one of us does what he feels in his bones is right. And yes, each one of us associates with those who feel the same way. But God is among us now. We have to leave behind what we feel if ever we hope to achieve peace of soul.

It's good to be dumped on ... It's a reminder that this isn't our world; that we're exiles somewhere between this world and the next. It's alright to hope, but not to put hope in this world. It's not so bad to be lied about ... It draws us toward humility and shields us from vain glory.

There's no religious order so lofty or monastery so remote that the Unwanted Visitor can't slip in and make some mischief.

Turn your eyes on yourself. Stop judging the faults of others. When others commit faults, we harden our hearts against them, excusing little because they should know better. But when we commit the very same faults, we soften our hearts, excusing much because of the wonderfulness of ourselves. Resist the rush to judgment. You know it's wrong and it wouldn't happen so often if God were truly the sole object of your gaze.

The one who has true and perfect Charity can't find himself in the mirror. He desires only that the Glory of God flare out in all things. He envies no one; he has no pet peeves; he doesn't rejoice in himself alone. All earthly things pressed down, filled to overflowing, beyond all measure, out of all
